BIG FALLS on THOMPSON RIVER



DESCRIPTION

Though the 4 mile trail (each way) to the vicinity of Big Falls is moderate, the final descent to the falls is extremely steep and dangerous! Even in ideal weather it requires rappelling by rope and multiple slides and scrambles. The danger multiplies if the ground is wet. Also, the area is so remote that prompt rescue in the event of accident is unlikely. This was demonstrated by a recent death, per delayed arrival of the emergency team. While the 50 ft fall and surrounding rockery are impressive, they are not easily viewed and are not among the best of our many waterfall viewing options. Accordingly, we no longer include this hike for BRR outings.

DIRECTIONS

Avoid these falls, pending major trail improvements.
